This manual contains important safety instructions. Please read and follow all instructions carefully during installation and operation of the unit Read this manual thoroughly before attempting to unpack, install, or operate your UPS.

CAUTION! To prevent the risk of fire or electric shock, install in a temperature and humidity controlled indoor area free of conductive contaminants. (Please see specifications for acceptable temperature and humidity range).

CAUTION! To reduce the risk of electric shock, do not remove the cover except to service the battery. Turn off and unplug the unit before servicing the batteries. There are no user serviceable parts inside except for the battery.

CAUTION! Hazardous live parts inside can be energized by the battery even when the AC input power is disconnected.

CAUTION! The UPS must be connected to an AC power outlet with fuse or circuit breaker protection. Do not plug into an outlet that is not grounded. If you need to de-energize this equipment, turn off and unplug the unit.

INSTALLING YOUR UPS SYSTEM

INTRODUCTION

Thank you for selecting a CyberPower Systems UPS product. This UPS is designed to provide unsurpassed power protection, operation and performance during the lifetime of the product.

UNPACKING

Inspect the UPS upon receipt. The box should contain the following:

SUPPORTS Active PFC POWER SUPPLIES

This CyberPower UPS system supports High Efficiency power supplies with Active Power Factor Correction (Active PFC). Active PFC is used to improve the efficiency of power delivery. The current US Energy Star® Program Requirements for Computers (version 5.0) mandates Active PFC for all power supplies over 100 watts. Additionally, programs such as 80 Plus® are often used to identify high efficiency power supplies with Active PFC.

OVERVIEW

The CP850PFCLCD/CP1000PFCLCD provides complete power protection from utility power that is not always consistent. The CP850PFCLCD/CP1000PFCLCD features 1030 Joules of surge protection, Both units provide long lasting battery backup during power outages with maintenance free batteries. The CP850PFCLCD/CP1000PFCLCD ensures consistent power to your computer system and includes software that will automatically save your open files and shutdown your computer system during a utility power loss.

AUTOMATIC VOLTAGE REGULATOR

The CP850PFCLCD/CP1000PFCLCD stabilizes inconsistent utility power voltage to nominal levels that are safe for equipment. Inconsistent incoming utility power may be damaging to important data files and hardware, but with Automatic Voltage Regulation (AVR), damaging voltage levels are corrected to safe levels. AVR automatically increases low utility power and decreases high utility power to a consistent and safe 110/120 volts. If incoming utility voltage drops below 90 volts, or exceeds 140 volts the units automatically switch to battery back-up power.

HOW TO DETERMINE THE POWER REQUIREMENTS OF YOUR EQUIPMENT

- 1. Ensure that the equipment plugged into the outlet does not exceed the UPS unit's rated capacity (850VA/510W for CP850PFCLCD, 1000VA/600W for CP1000PFCLCD). If the rated capacities of the unit are exceeded, an overload condition may occur and cause the UPS unit to shut down or the circuit breaker to trip.
- 2. There are many factors that can affect the amount of power that your computer system will require. It is suggested that the load placed on the battery outlets not exceed 80% of the unit's capacity.

HARDWARE INSTALLATION GUIDE

- Your new UPS may be used immediately upon receipt. However, after receiving a new UPS, to ensure the battery's maximum charge capacity, it is recommended that you charge the battery for at least 8 hours. Your UPS is equipped with an auto-charge feature. When the UPS is plugged into an AC outlet, the battery will automatically charge whether the UPS is turned on or off.

What is AVR?

Automatic Voltage Regulator


- 2. With the UPS unit turned off and unplugged, connect your computer, monitor, and any other peripherals requiring battery backup into the battery power supplied outlets. DO NOT plug a laser printer, paper shredder, copier, space heater, vacuum, sump pump or other large electrical devices into the "Battery and Surge Protected Outlets". The power demands of these devices may overload and damage the unit.
- 3. To protect a fax, phone or modem, connect a telephone cable or network cable from the wall jack outlet to the IN jack of the UPS. Connect a telephone cable or network cable from the OUT jack of the UPS to a fax machine telephone, modem, or network devices.

OUT

- 4. Plug the UPS into a 2 pole, 3 wire grounded receptacle (wall outlet). Make sure the wall branch outlet is protected by a fuse or circuit breaker and does not service equipment with large electrical demands (e.g. air conditioner, copier, etc...). The warranty prohibits the use of extension cords, outlet strips, and surge strips.
- 5. Press the power switch to turn the unit on. The Power On indicator light will illuminate and the unit will "beep". If an overload is detected, an audible alarm will sound and the unit will emit one long beep. To correct this, turn the UPS off and unplug at least one piece of equipment from the battery power supplied outlets. Make sure the circuit breaker is depressed and then turn the UPS on.
- 6. To maintain optimal battery charge, leave the UPS plugged into an AC outlet at all times.
- 7. To store the UPS for an extended period, cover it and store with the battery fully charged. While in storage, recharge the battery every three months to ensure battery life.
- 8. For pluggable equipment, the socket-outlet shall be installed near the equipment and shall be easily accessible.

BASIC OPERATION

DESCRIPTION



Used as the master on/off switch for equipment connected to the battery power supplied outlets.

Power On Indicator

3 LCD module display

This LED is illuminated when the utility power is normal and the UPS outlets are providing power, free of surges and spikes.

High resolution and intelligent LCD display shows all the UPS information using icons and messages. For more information please review the "Definitions for Illuminated LCD Indicators" section below 4 Display switch

The switch can be used to select the LCD display contents including Input Voltage, Output Voltage, and Estimated Run Time. The toggle frequency is set to one time per 0.5 second. Press the switch to roll down the function menu. Pressing the switch for 2 seconds will turn the LCD display on or off while in AC/Utility power mode.

5 Silence Alarm switch

The toggle frequency is set to one time per 0.5 second. Press the switch to roll up the function menu. Holding the switch for more than 2 seconds while running on battery will silence the buzzer.

Control switch

Press the Control switch for 3 seconds in AC/Utility Power Mode to perform a Self Test of the battery.

7 Battery and Surge Protected Outlets

The unit has five battery powered/surge suppression outlets for connected equipment to ensure temporary uninterrupted operation of your equipment during a power failure. (DO NOT plug a laser printer, paper shredder, copier, space heater, vacuum, sump pump or other large electrical devices into the "Battery and Surge Protected Outlets". The power demands of these devices may overload and damage the unit.)

Full-Time Surge Protection Outlets

The unit has five surge suppression outlets.

9 Circuit Breaker

Located on the back of the UPS, the circuit breaker serves to provide overload and fault protection.

10 Serial/USB Ports to PC

The USB port allows connection and communication between the USB port on the computer and the UPS unit.

Communication protection ports will protect any standard modem, fax, telephone line, network or Ethernet connection (RJ11/RJ45). 12 Wiring Fault Indicator (red)

This LED indicator will illuminate to warn the user that a wiring problem exists, such as bad ground, missing ground or reversed wiring. this is illuminated, disconnect all electrical equipment from the outlet and have an electrician verify the outlet is properly wired. The unit will not provide surge protection without being plugged into a grounded and properly wired wall outlet.

The Coax/Cable/DSS protection ports will protect any cable modem, CATV converter, or DSS receiver.

REPLACING THE BATTERY

Replacement of batteries located in an OPERATOR ACCESS AREA.

- When replacing batteries, replace with the same number of the following battery: CyberPower / RB1280A for the CP850PFCLCD;
- CAUTION! Risk of Energy Hazard, 12 V, maximum 9 Ampere-hour battery. Before replacing batteries, remove conductive jewelry such as chains, wrist watches, and rings. High energy conducted through these materials could cause severe burns.
- CAUTION! Do not dispose of batteries in a fire. The batteries may explode.
- CAUTION! Do not open or mutilate batteries. Released material is harmful to the skin and eyes. It may be toxic.

BATTERY REPLACEMENT PROCEDURE:

- Turn off and unplug all connected equipment.
- Turn the UPS off and unplug it from the AC power source.
- Remove the retaining screw located on the bottom of the UPS
- Slide the battery compartment cover completely off of the unit.

11. Recharge the UPS for 8-16 hours to fully charge the battery.

- 7. Disconnect the battery wires from the batteries. 8.
- Install the replacement batteries by connecting the red wire (+) and black wire (-) to the same color connectors from the battery pack. Put the batteries back into the compartment.
- 10. Slide back the battery compartment cover and tighten the retaining screw.










SETTING TIME TO TURN ON EVENT TIME TO SHUT DOWN

REMINDER: Batteries are considered HAZARDOUS WASTE and must be disposed of properly. Most retailers that sell lead-acid batteries collect used batteries for recycling, as required by local regulations.

DEFINITIONS FOR ILLUMINATED LCD INDICATORS

- ONLINE: The UPS is supplying utility power to connected equipment
- 2. BATTERY: During a severe brownout or blackout, this icon appears and an alarm sounds (two short beeps followed by a pause) to indicate the UPS is operating from its internal batteries. During a prolonged brownout or blackout, the alarm will beep rapidly every 1/2 second (and the BATT.CAPACITY meter shows one 20% capacity segment shaded. The capacity depends on how much load added and the runtime left.) to indicate the UPS's batteries are nearly out of power. You should save files and turn off your equipment immediately or allow the software to shut the system down.
- $\textbf{3.} \quad \textbf{Energy-Saving:} \ \textbf{The UPS in energy-saving bypass mode.} \ \textbf{See "CyberPower}$ nology" section for more info
- 4. LOAD capacity / Sensitivity setup: This meter displays the approximate output load level (in 20% increments) of the UPS battery outlets. It can also be sensitivity setup meter if you are in programming mode. It is to control the sensitivity of the UPS to switch to Battery Mode by selecting UPS shutdown voltage range. The higher the sensitivity, the easier the UPS will switch to Battery Mode.



- blackout or severe brownout, the UPS switches to battery power, the BATTERY icon appears, and the charge level decreases 6. FAULT: This icon appears if there is a problem with the UPS. Press the POWER button to turn off the UPS.

F01: Battery Mode or AC/Utility Power Mode Overload fault (Turn on the UPS again.)

F02: Battery Output Short fault (Turn on the UPS again.)

F03: Charger Fault (Contact CyberPower Systems for support.)

F04: Internal Fault (Contact CyberPower Systems for support.)

- 7. OVER LOAD: This icon appears and an alarm sounds to indicate the battery-supplied outlets are overloaded. To clear the overload, unplug some of your equipment from the battery-supplied outlets until the icon turns off and the alarm stops.
- 8. SCHEDULE: Users can setup the schedule to turn on and shut down the computer and UPS through PowerPanel® Personal Edition software. The LCD display will show how much time that the UPS is about to turn on or shut down
- 9. ESTIMATED RUNTIME: This displays the run time estimate of the UPS with current battery capacity and load.
- 10. OUTPUT meter: This meter measure, in real time, the AC voltage that the UPS system is providing to the computer, such as normal AC line mode, AVR mode, and battery backup mode. (Note: The OUTPUT meter shows the status of the battery backup outlets in terms of load, frequency, and voltage.)
- 11. INPUT meter: This meter measures the AC voltage that the UPS system is receiving from the utility wall outlet. The UPS is designed, through the use of automatic voltage regulation, to continuously correct output voltage to connected equipment to a safe 110/120 voltage output range. In the event of a complete power loss, severe brownout, or over-voltage, the UPS relies on its internal battery to supply consistent 110/120 output voltage. The INPUT voltage meter can be used as a diagnostic tool to identify poor-quality input power.
- 13. MUTE: This icon appears whenever the UPS is in silent mode. The buzzer does not beep during silent mode until the battery reaches

low capacity

14. AVR (Automatic Voltage Regulation): This icon appears whenever your UPS is automatically correcting low AC line voltage without using battery power. This is a normal, automatic operation of your UPS, and no action is required on your part.

TROUBLESHOOTING

| | The USB / serial cable is connected to the wrong port. | Check the back of the computer for an additional USB / serial port. Move the cable to this port. |

By using the Product you consent to be bound by and become a party to the terms and conditions of this Limited Warranty and Connected Equipment Guarantee (together referred to as this "Warranty"). If you do not agree to the terms and conditions of this Warranty, you should return the Product for a full refund prior to using it.

Who is Providing this Warranty?

CyberPower Systems (USA), Inc. ("CyberPower") provides this Limited Warranty.

What Does This Warranty Cover?

This warranty covers defects in materials and workmanship in the Product under normal use and conditions. It also covers equipment that was connected to the Product and damaged because of the failure of the Product.

What is the Period of Coverage?

This warranty covers the Product for three years and connected equipment for as long as you own the Product.

Who Is Covered?

This warranty only covers the original purchaser. Coverage ends if you sell or otherwise transfer the Product.

How Do You Get Warranty Service?

- Before contacting CyberPower, identify Your Product model number, the Purchase Date, and each item of Connected Equipment (E.G. Computer tower, Computer Monitor, Ink Jet Printer, Cable Modem, etc).
- 2. Visit our web site at http://www.cpsww.com/support or Call us at (877) 297-6937.
- 3. If your product requires warranty service you must provide a copy of your dated purchase receipt or invoice

How Do You Open A Connected Equipment Claim?

- Call us at (877) 297-6937 or write to us at Cyber Power Systems (USA), Inc., 4241 12th Ave. E., STE 400, Shakopee, MN 55379, or send us an e-mail message at claims@cpsww.com for instructions, within 10 days of the occurrence.
- When you contact CyberPower, identify the Product, the Purchase Date, and the item(s) of Connected Equipment. Have information on all applicable insurance or other resources of recovery/payment that are available to the Initial Customer and Request a Claim Number.
- You must provide a dated purchase receipt (or other proof of the original purchase) and provide a description of the damage to your connected equipment.
- 4. Pack and ship the product to CyberPower and, if requested, the item(s) of Connected Equipment, a repair cost estimate for the damage to the Connected Equipment, and all claim forms that CyberPower provides to you. Show the Claim Number on the shipping label or include it with the product. You must prepay all shipping costs, you are responsible for packaging and shipment, and you must pay the cost of the repair estimate.

How Long Do I Have To Make A Claim?

All claims must be made within ten days of the occurrence.

What Will We Do To Correct Problems?

CyberPower will inspect and examine the Product.

If the Product is defective in material or workmanship, CyberPower will repair or replace it at CyberPower's expense, or, if CyberPower is unable to or decides not to repair or replace the Product (if defective) within a reasonable time, CyberPower will refund to you the full purchase price you paid for the Product (purchase receipt showing price paid is required).

If it appears that our Product failed to protect any equipment plugged into it, we will also send you forms for making your claim for the connected equipment. We will repair or replace the equipment that was damaged because of the failure of our Product or pay you the fair market value (NOT REPLACEMENT COST) of the equipment at of the time of the damage. We will use Orion Blue Book, or another a third-party valuation guide, or eBay, craigslist, or other source to establish that amount. Our maximum liability is limited to \$250,000 for the CP850PFCLCD and \$350,000 for the CP1000PFCLCD.

Who Pays For Shipping?

We pay when we send items to you; you pay when you send items to us.

What isn't covered by the warranty?

- This Warranty does not cover any software that was damaged or needs to be replaced due to the failure of the Product or any data that is lost as a result of the failure or the restoration of data or records, or the reinstallation of software.
- 2. This Warranty does not cover or apply to: misuse, modification, operation or storage outside environmental limits of the Product or the equipment connected to it, nor for damage while in transit or in storage, nor if there has been improper operation or maintenance, or use with items not designed or intended for use with the Product, such as laser printers, appliances, aquariums, medical or life support devices, etc.

What are the Limitations?

The sole and exclusive remedies of the Initial Customer are those provided by this Warranty.

- This Warranty does not apply unless the Product and the equipment that was connected to it were connected to properly wired
 and grounded outlets (including compliance with electrical and safety codes of the most current electrical code), without the use
 of any adapters or other connectors.
- The Product must have been plugged directly into the power source and the equipment connected to the Product must be
 directly connected to the Product and not "daisy-chained" together in serial fashion with any extension cords, another Product
 or device similar to the Product, surge suppressor, or power tap. Any such installation voids the Limited Warranty.
- The Product and equipment connected to it must have been used properly in a suitable and proper environment and in conformance with any license, instruction manual, or warnings provided with the Product and the equipment connected to it.
- 4. The Product must have been used at all times within the limitations on the Product's VA capacity.

The Product was designed to eliminate disrupting and damaging effects of momentary (less than 1ms) voltage spikes or impulses from lightning or other power transients. If it can be shown that a voltage spike lasting longer than 1ms has occurred, the occurrence will be deemed outside the rated capabilities of the Product and the Limited Warranty is void. CyberPower Does Not Cover or Undertake Any Liability in Any Event for Any of the Following:

- 1. Loss of or damage to data, records, or software or the restoration of data or records, or the reinstallation of software
- 2.
