## 1.1 Using for the First Time

Your TES-221 is powered by one CR-2032, 3-volt lithium battery. Before using the device, gently pull the battery insulation tab to remove it. Pressing the reset button with more than light pressure may permanently disable your unit.

## 1.2 Replacing the Battery

Replace the battery when you see the low battery indicator. Please have a small screwdriver at hand before you follow the steps below. Warning! If the battery wears out completely, or if you take more than a few seconds while changing the battery, any user entered information may be erased. You should always keep written copies of your important information

- 1. Turn the unit off and turn it over.
- 2. Use the screwdriver to unscrew the battery cover screw.
- 3. Push gently on the tab of the battery
- 4. Remove the old battery.
