	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ <b>Press</b> to display the menu screen.</li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ <b>Press and hold</b> to move to the main menu.</li> <li>■ <b>Press</b> to return to the previous stage.</li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ <b>Press and hold</b> to start recording.</li> <li>■ <b>Press</b> to set section repetition, stop recording and add to/delete from the playlist.</li> </ul>
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ <b>Press</b> to move to the selected menu/confirm and save your selection.</li> </ul>

# Charging the battery

Fully charge the rechargeable battery before using the player for the first time or when it has not been used for a while.



**1** Connect the USB cable to the USB port ( ) on your PC.

**2** Connect the other end of the USB cable to the USB Connection Port on the bottom of the player.

- When connected with the USB cable, it takes about 4 hours for the player to fully charge although this may vary depending on your PC environment.

## Battery Use

- Recharge and store within the temperature range of 5°C~35°C(40°F~95°F).
- Do not overcharge (longer than 12 hours). Excessive charging or discharging may shorten the battery's life.
- Battery life naturally shortens slowly over time as it is a consumable item.



- If you are charging the player while it is connected to your Notebook, make sure the Notebook's battery is also fully charged.

# Basic Use

## Turning the Power On & Off



### Turning the Power On

Press and hold the [▶||/⏻] button

- Power is turned on.

### Turning the Power Off

Press and hold the [▶||/⏻] button

- Power is turned off.



NOTE

- Power is automatically turned off when none of the buttons have been pressed for a preset period of time (Default: 1 minute) in the pause mode. ▶ Page 69

## Playing Music



- 1 Press the [^v] button to select <Music> and then press the [⋮] button.
- 2 Press the [^v<>] button to select the desired music file.
- 3 Press the [⋮] button.
  - The music file will begin playing.



NOTE

- Press the [⋮] button to move to the sub level.
- Press the [BACK] button to move to the previous screen.


## Volume Control



Press the [ ^ v ] button.

- You will see a volume control icon.
- Press the ^ button to increase the volume or the v button to decrease it.

## Lock Function



In Hold mode, all buttons are disabled. This function is useful when you are walking or jogging.

- 1** Push the [HOLD] switch in the direction of the arrow.
- 2** Push the [HOLD] switch in the opposite direction of the arrow to release the Lock function.

## Searching for Files with <File Browser>



Search easily for files using the <File Browser> function.



- 1** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <File Browser>.
- 2** Press the [ ::: ] button.
  - The <File Browser> folder list containing Music, Text, Pictures and Video appears.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select a folder of your choice.
- 4** Use the [ ::: ] button to move to the file list in the selected folder.
  - Use the [ < ] button to move to the upper step.
- 5** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select a file of your choice.
- 6** Press the [ ::: ] button.
  - The selected file will start playing.

## Reset Function



If a product malfunction occurs, you can re-initialize the system.

**Press and hold the [MENU] and [A ← B/●] buttons at the same time.**

- The system will be initialized.
- Your settings and files will not be affected.

# Installing Samsung Media Studio


Use Media Studio to transfer music files from your PC to the player.



# Connecting to your PC

**2** Connect the other end of the USB cable to the USB Connection Port on bottom of the player.

- <USB Connected> appears on the screen display of the player.







# Listening to Music

**Before you start!**

Connect the earphones, then turn on the player, and check the battery.


**1,2,3**

- 1** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Music> and then press the [ :::: ] button.
- 2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the desired list and then press the [ :::: ] button.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v < > ] button to select the file to play and then press the [ :::: ] button.

- The music file starts to play.

- <Now Playing> : You can listen to the last played music or recording file.
- <Artists> : To play by artist
- <Albums> : To play by album
- <Tracks> : To play in numeric or alphabetical order
- <Genres> : To play by genre
- <Playlists> : To play by Playlist


**NOTE**

- The music files compatible with the player are MP3, WMA.
- MP1 or MP2 files which only have a changed extension to MP3, may not play on the player.
- A file without an ID3 Tag (Unknown) is displayed as [Unknown].
- If you press the [ :::: ] button in Music mode, the "S" mark appears on the screen and the Street mode is set to On. Pressing the [ :::: ] again to disappear "S" and set off the Street mode. ► Page 67

## | To Pause

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- 1 Press the [ ▶||⏸ ] button while the music is playing.**
  - The music playback will be paused.
  
- 2 Press the [ ▶||⏸ ] button again.**
  - The music will play from the point where it stopped.

## | To search within a track

---

- 1 Press and hold the [ < > ] button while the selected track is playing.**
  - It searches to the beginning or the end of the track.
  
- 2 Release the button at the point you wish to start.**
  - It starts playing from the point you release the button.

## Listening to Music (Continued)

### To Play from the beginning of the current track

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Press the [ < ] button after 5 seconds of play.

- The current track starts playing from the beginning.

### To play the previous/next track

---

Press the [ < ] button within 5 seconds of play.

- The previous track will start playing.

Press the [ > ] button.

- The next track will start playing.



- When playing VBR files, the previous track may not play even if you press the [ < ] button within 5 seconds of the play.

# Section Repetition

This function enables you to listen to specific parts of a track repeatedly. Recommended for language learning.



## To set a section for repetition

- 1 Play a file of your choice.
- 2 Press the [A → B/●] button at the beginning of the section you want to repeat.
  - The starting point is set and <A → > will appear in the screen display window.
- 3 Press the [A → B/●] button again to set the ending of the section you want to repeat.
  - <A → B> will appear on the screen and the specified section starts to play repeatedly.

## To cancel the section repetition

Press the [A → B/●] button again during Section Repeat.

- Section Repeat will be canceled.




### NOTE

- You can set the start and end points of the section repetition only within a single file.

# Creating Playlist Using Samsung Media Studio

A playlist is a list of your favorite songs.



**1** Click <My Album> on the top of Media Studio.

- The <My Album> window appears.

**2** Click <New Album> on the bottom.

- The Creation window appears.

**3** Type in the album title and click <OK>.

- A new album (playlist) will be created and stored in the My Album section of Media Studio.

## Adding Music files to a Playlist



**1** Click <My PC> on the top of Media Studio.

- The My PC window appears.

**2** Click <My Album> in the right corner of the window.

- The My Album window appears.

**3** Double click on a desired album in the right window.

**4** Select files that you want to transfer in the <My PC> window.

**5** Click  icon.

- The selected files will be added to the album (playlist).



NOTE

- A maximum of 999 playlists transferred to the player can be played.

## Exporting a Playlist to your Player Using Media Studio



**1** Click <My Album> on the top of Media Studio.

- The My Album window appears.

**2** Click <Portable> in the right corner of the window.

- The Portable window appears.

**3** Select a desired album in the <My Album> list.


**4** Click  icon.

- The selected album will be transferred to the player and stored in <File Browser> → <Playlists>.

## To make your own Playlist



### How To 1

- 1** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <File Browser> and then press the [ :::] button.
- 2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Music> and then press the [ :::] button.
  - The file list appears.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v < > ] button to select a file to add to the playlist and then press the [ A → B/● ] button.
  - Next to the selected file, the mark ★ appears and the file is included in <File Browser> → <Playlists> → <Favorites>.



#### NOTE

- You can add up to 100 music files to <Favorites>.
- If you want to remove a file from the <Favorites>, select a file marked with ★ and then press the [ A → B/● ] button. Alternately, you can press the [ MENU ] button to select <Delete from Favorites> and press the [ :::] button.

## To make your own Playlist (Continued)



### How To 2

- 1 Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <File Browser> and then press the [ :::: ] button.



- 3** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the playlist of your choice, then press the [ :::: ] button.
  - The music files saved in the selected Playlist will appear.
- 4** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the file to play and then press the [ :::: ] button.
  - The music file will start playing.

# Using Music menu

## To select Street mode

This allows you to enjoy the music outdoors as clearly as indoors.



- 1** Press the [MENU] button when you are in the music playback mode.
- 2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Street Mode> and then press the [ ::: ] button.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the desired mode and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - Select <On>.

## To select 3D surround sound (DNSe)

You can listen to the music with 3D surround sound.




- 1** Press the [MENU] button when you are in the music playback mode.
- 2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <DNSe> and then press the [ ::: ] button.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the desired mode and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - Select either <3D-User> <3D-Studio> <3D-Stage> <3D-Club> <Normal> <Rock> <House> <Dance> <Jazz> <Ballad> <Rhythm & Blues> <Classical> or <User EQ>.

To exit the menu, press the [MENU] button.

## Using Music menu (Continued)

### To select Play mode (Repeat)



- 1 Press the [MENU] button when you are in the music playback mode.
- 2 Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Play Mode> and then press the [ ::: ] button.
- 3 Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the desired mode and then press the [ ::: ] button.

- Select either <Normal> <Repeat> <Repeat One> or <Shuffle>.

- <Normal> : To play all the tracks in order one time.
- <Repeat> : To repeat the current folder.
- <Repeat One> : To repeat one file.
- <Shuffle> : To play files at random.

### To select a background image for Music mode

You can set a background image for Music mode.



- 1 Press the [MENU] button when you are in the music playback mode.
- 2 Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Music Background> and then press the [ ::: ] button.
- 3 Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the desired background image and then press the [ ::: ] button.

- Select either <FLASH1> <FLASH2> <FLASH3> <Album Cover> <Photo> or <Auto>.
- Selecting <Auto> will change the background image by picking one from <FLASH1> to <FLASH3> each time a different file is played.




#### NOTE

- If there is an image contained in the tag information of a music file, it will be displayed as a background image when you have selected <Album Cover>. <Album Cover> supports only less than 200 pixel (horizontal) x 200 pixel (vertical) in size.

## To select the play speed


You can select the play speed either faster or lower.



- 1** Press the [MENU] button when you are in the music playback mode.
- 2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Play Speed> and then press the [ ::: ] button.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the play speed and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - Select either <-3> <-2> <-1> <0>(Normal) <+1> <+2> or <+3>.
  - The larger the number, the faster the speed of play.

## To set the skip interval

You can set the playback interval when you press the [ < > ] button during playback.



- 1** Press the [MENU] button when you are in the music playback mode.
- 2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Skip Interval> and then press the [ ::: ] button.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the desired skip interval and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - Select either <1track> <3sec> <5sec> <7sec> <10sec> <30sec> or <1min>.

**Before you start!** Connect the earphones, then turn on the player, and check the battery.

**1** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Video> and then press the [ ::: ] button.

**2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the desired video clip and then press the [ ::: ] button.

- The selected video file starts to play.

### To stop playing the video file

**Press the [ ▶||/⏪ ] button in Video mode.**

- Each time you press the [ ▶||/⏪ ] button, the player stops playing the video file or resumes playback.



**NOTE**

- When transferring a video file to the player using <Media Studio>, it is automatically converted into SVI format before transfer. The file size is automatically adjusted, too.

## Video Information Display

Press the [⋮] button in Video mode.

- Information on the current video appears. Press the [⋮] button again to disappear the information.

## Video (Continued)

### To move to a certain position of the current video file

---



**1** In a horizontal view, press and hold the [ < > ] button.

- This enables you to scroll through the current video file.

**2** Release the button when you have moved to the desired position.

- The video starts playing from the position.

### To play the previous/next video file

---



Press the [ < ] button within 5 seconds after the current video started playing.

- This will return to the previous movie.

Press the [ > ] button.

- This will move to the next movie.

# Using Video menu

## To set a bookmark



Press the [A ↔ B/●] button at the desired scene.


- The currently played/stopped point is set to a bookmark.



NOTE

- You can set a maximum of 20 bookmarks.

## To Move to/remove the bookmark



**1** Press the [MENU] button in Video mode.

- The Bookmark menu appears.

**2** Press the [⋮] button.

**3** Press the [^ ∨] button to select <Go to> or <Delete> and press the [⋮] button.

- When you selected <Go To> then it will move to the selected bookmark and <Delete> will remove the selected bookmark from the video file.

# Photo Viewing

**Before you start!**

Connect the earphones, then turn on the player, and check the battery.

**1** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Photo> and then press the [ ::: ] button.

- The photo preview window appears.

**2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the desired photo and then press the [ ::: ] button.

- The selected photo is displayed.

**NOTE**

- When transferring a photo file to the player using <Media Studio>, it is automatically converted into JPG format before transfer. The file size is automatically adjusted, too.
- You can also use the <File Browser> to search for a photo file. ▶ Page 14
- You can keep listening to music even if you select <Photo> to view a photo.


## To move to the previous/next photo

---

Press the [ < > ] button while viewing a photo or press the [ ^ v ] button in preview mode to display the previous or next photo.



## Photo Enlarging



- 1** Press the [MENU] while viewing a photo
- 2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Zoom> and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - The Zoom Setting menu appears.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the desired scale factor and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - You can select either <100%> <200%> or <400%>.
- 4** Press the [ ^ v < > ] to move to the portion of the photo to magnify.
- 5** To cancel the magnification, select <100%> from the Zoom options and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - This returns to the original size.


**NOTE**

- Press the [ ::: ] button in the Photo Viewing mode to display the Zoom Setting menu.

# Using Photo menu (Continued)

## To set the photo as a music background image

---



- 1** Select a photo file to set as a background image.
- 2** Press the [MENU] while viewing the photo.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <As Music Background> and then press the [ :::: ] button.
  - The Music Background Image Setting menu appears.
- 4** Press the [ < > ] button to select <Yes> and then press the [ :::: ] button.
  - The selected photo file is set to a background image for music.

**NOTE**

- Press the [A → B/•] button while viewing a photo to display the Music Background Setting menu.

# Text Viewing

You can read a novel or see the manuscript text of a news story or soap opera while listening to music.

## Before you start!

Turn on the player, and check the battery.

**1** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Text> and then press the [ ⋮ ] button.

**2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select Text and then press the [ ⋮ ] button.

- You will see the text on the screen.

## To scroll the text by the line

Press the [ < > ] button.

- Once you set <Scroll By> → <Page> in Text mode, you can move to the previous / next page of the text file.
- Once you set <Scroll By> → <Line> in Text mode, you can move to the previous / next line of the text file. Press and hold the [ < > ] button to move up or down faster through the file.



- This product supports the TXT file format in Text mode.
- You can keep listening to music even if you select <Text>.

# Using FM Radio menu

## To set RDS Display



RDS (Radio Data System) provides the reception and display of messages such as broadcasting information. The program information such as News, Sports or Music, or the broadcasting station information is displayed on the screen.

- 2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <RDS Display> and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - The RDS Display menu appears.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the RDS display mode and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - You can select from <Program Service> and <Program Type>.

- <Program Service> : Displays the name of broadcasting station and is composed of 8 characters. If the PS information is being received, the PS name (BBC, AFO, NDR, etc.) is shown on the display. If the PS information isn't received, the original FM frequency is shown.
- <Program Type> : Displays the type of program currently being broadcast.



### NOTE

- If FM signal strength is weak, the RDS information might not be displayed.

## To set FM region



- 1** Press the [MENU] button in FM Radio mode.
- 2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <FM Region> and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - The FM Region menu appears.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the FM Region and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - You can select from <Korea/US> <Japan> <Other Countries>.



NOTE

- Frequency range by region
  - Korea/US: Search for FM frequencies in 100 kHz increments between 87.5 MHz~108.0 MHz.
  - Japan: Search for FM frequencies in 100 kHz increments between 76.0 MHz~108.0 MHz.
  - Other Countries: Search for FM frequencies in 50 kHz increments between 87.50 MHz~108.00 MHz.
- FM region can be deleted or changed according to the target region of the player.
- If you change the FM region, the previously stored radio frequencies are removed.

## To set FM sensitivity



- 1** Press the [MENU] button in FM Radio mode.
- 2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <FM Sensitivity> and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - The FM Sensitivity menu appears.
- 3** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the search level and then press the [ ::: ] button.
  - You can select from <High> <Middle> and <Low>.
  - The higher FM Sensitivity is, the more frequencies can be received.

# Recording



## File names during recording


- 1** In recording, a recording file name is automatically specified in such as “Xmmddhhmmss”. Where X indicates the recording type, mm for a month, dd for a date, mm for minutes and ss indicates seconds.
- 2** The type of recording is as follows;
  - Voice - V
  - Radio – F (FM)
- 3** For instance, the file name “V0911103020” indicates a voice recording was made 10 o'clock 30 minutes 20 seconds on September 11th.



### NOTE

- To listen to saved recording files, use the <File Browser> function. ▶ Page 14
- For more information on recording, see the recording setting section on page 68.
- You can set or store a maximum of 999 files for each of voice and FM radio recording.

# Recording



**1** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Record> and then press the [ ⋮ ] button.

- Then, press the [MENU] button and use the [ ^ v ] and [ ⋮ ] buttons to set your recording options.

**2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select the desired recording mode and press the [ ⋮ ] button.

- The appropriate window appears.

**3** Press the [ A ← B / ● ] button.

- Recording is started with displaying the file name to save.

- <Record Voice>: you can make a voice recording.
- <Record FM Radio>: you can record the FM radio broadcasting that you listened to the last time. You can use the [ < > ] button to select a desired frequency.
- <Recorded Files>: you can listen to voice recording and FM radio recording.

## To stop recording

# Voice/FM Radio Recording



## To make a voice recording

You can make voice recording at any time while using different functions.

Press and hold the [A ↔ B/●] button.

- Recording is started with displaying the file name to save.

## To record FM radio broadcasting

You can record FM radio broadcasting at any time while listening to the radio.

In FM Radio mode, press and hold the [A ↔ B/●] button.

- An automatically created file name appears and the recording starts.



NOTE

- Do not place the microphone too close or too far away during recording, as this can affect the recording quality.
- Voice recording does not perform properly when the battery is low.
- You can make a voice recording for about 69 hours (based on 32Kbps, 1GB)

# Using Bluetooth

Register a Bluetooth-compliant stereo headset with your player before you can configure the wireless connection. When done, you can listen to the music through the Bluetooth headset.

(The Bluetooth feature can be applied only for the appropriate model (YP-T9B, T9JB))

## What is Bluetooth?

**Bluetooth is a computing and telecommunications industry specification that describes how mobile phones, computers and PDAs can easily interconnect with each other and with home and business phones and computers using a short wireless connection.**

- **The Bluetooth device can cause a noise or malfunction, depending on the use conditions.**
  - Electrical interference from a physical contact on the product, for instance, if you take the product on the one hand and wear the stereo headset.
  - From a physical contact on the transmitter or receiver of the product or the stereo headset
  - Electrical variation from electrical jamming by the wall, corner or office partitioning
  - Electrical interference from the same frequency-band devices including medical equipment, microwave oven and wireless LAN.
- **The longer the distance between the product and the stereo headset is, the quality will be deteriorated in proportion and if the distance exceeds a certain range, the wireless networking is disconnected.**
- **When pairing the Bluetooth device with the product, make it within a short distance as possible.**
- **You are not recommended to use text and photo view modes while listening to the music with the headset. Otherwise, it can cause a delayed response of the button operation and interference with the Bluetooth communications.**
- **In poor reception-sensitivity areas such as inside the lift or under the ground, the Bluetooth connection may not work properly.**
- **A file at lower than 32 kHz may not be played, depending on the specification of the stereo headset.**

## Using Bluetooth (Continued)

### Bluetooth Specification

The performance of a Bluetooth device can vary, depending on the specification. This product is compliant with the standard Bluetooth specifications.

- **Specifications for certain purposes:** In general, the transmission output is great, causing less reduction of the signal strength but requiring more power from the battery.
- **Standard Specifications:** The transmission output is comparatively low, which causes more reduction of the signal strength but minimizes the power consumption to increase the useful time.


**NOTE**

- When not in use, set the <Bluetooth Mode> to <OFF>. If you stay in <ON> for <Bluetooth Mode>, the useful time of the battery is reduced.

- Ensure that the Bluetooth device to connect is ready for pairing. (Refer to the product's documentation of the device.)

Selecting <Auto> will change the background image by picking one from <FLASH1> to <FLASH3> each time a different file is played.
- **<Text Viewer Color>** : You can set the background color for text. Choose one from 6 colors.
- **<Text Viewer Type>** : You can choose to view the text either vertically or horizontally. You can select either <Vertical> or <Horizontal>.
- **<LCD Brightness>** : You can adjust the brightness of the display light. Select one from <0-10>.

# Setting Language

Set the language for the menu and track information (ID3 Tag).



### ■ What is ID3-Tag?

This is what is attached to an MP3 to carry information relevant to the file, such as the title, artist, album, year, genre and a comment file.

# Setting System

You can set the booting mode, resume and button sound.



**1** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <Settings> and then press the [ :::: ] button.

- The Settings menu appears.

**2** Press the [ ^ v ] button to select <System> and then press the [ :::: ] button.

- The System menu appears.

**3** Use the [ ^ v < > ] and [ :::: ] buttons to set the desired functions

- **<Booting Mode>** : You can set the start window after the system reboots. Select either <Main Menu> and <Last Played>.
- **<Resume>** : Specifies the starting point to restart playback after playback is stopped. If set to <Off>, the last file will play from the beginning. If set to <On>, the last file will play from the point it was previously stopped.
- **<Button Sound>** : Sets the beep sound for button operations to on or off. Select either <On> or <Off>.
- **<Volume Limit>** : You can avoid hearing damage by setting the limit of the volume when using the earphone. <On> will limit the maximum volume level up to 20. The maximum volume level when Volume Limit is set to <Off> is 40.
- **<Default Set>** : Returns all settings to the default value. Select from <Yes> and <No>.

- **<Firmware Version>** : Displays the current firmware version.


